

The Cincinnati Health Department (CHD) is now offering evening H1N1 vaccination walk-in sessions for individuals classified as “high priority” (Tier One). Both the injectable and nasal mist form of the vaccine are available. **This schedule will run through December 17th, 2009:**

High Priority groups include:

- Health Care Workers including Emergency Medical Services Personnel
- Expectant Mother’s
- Individuals ages 6 months to 24 years of age
- Individuals ages 25-64 who have certain underlying medical conditions
- Caregivers and household contacts of children less than 6 months old
