### Heaven's Gain Ministries

We are so blessed to be living on the "West Side" of Cincinnati. The sense of a welcoming community is an overwhelming theme on the West Side. So, I want to highlight a ministry that started right here on the West Side of Cincinnati. Heaven's Gain Ministries is a nonprofit organization that specializes in providing services and products for families suffering the loss of a child through miscarriage, stillbirth, or infant death. They are a located at 6962 Harrison Avenue. You may have passed the little building and wondered what it was all about.

The founders Jim and Donna Murphy explain on their website that "Heaven's Gain started out of our own miscarriage experiences at 9, 14, and 17 weeks. We were frustrated that we were unable to find a little baby casket for any of our miscarried babies. Even a casket for early stillborn baby was difficult to find."

"We believed each miscarried and stillborn baby is truly a loss. Proper burial of our miscarried/stillborn babies in a little casket was very important to us. Even after diligently searching, we were not able to find a little baby casket or tiny coffin for any of our miscarried babies. We did not want any other family to be in this situation and so we start Heaven's Gain. It is so important for us to offer dignified caskets and urns for families experiencing the loss of a baby. We also offer support, advocacy, and guidance for grieving families. We hope we can serve as a part of your healing as you grieve the loss of your baby."

Donna and Jim are the parents of eleven children: three in Heaven, and eight on earth. After feeling the call to start the ministry, they researched for a year in 2007, and opened the ministry in February of 2008. They contracted skilled wood crafters to make their baby caskets.

Jim makes urns in their home and they both continue to work as volunteers. After a year of study, from 2012-2013, Donna became a Certified Loss Doula to better help serve their clients. Their ministry is reaching and helping people in the U.S and around the world.

If you would like to make a difference for families experiencing a loss of a baby, please consider volunteering with their ministry. Several opportunities for various skills are needed: RN's, crafters, woodworkers, maintenance, artists, data entry, IT, social media, cleaning, grant writer.

Please remember Heaven's Gain in your prayers and if someone you know is experiencing a loss or is struggling with a loss from their past. They are there to help.

A 14-day quarantine period presents the lowest risk of post-quarantine transmission. This strategy is preferred for people living in, working at, or visiting congregate living facl//tles, high density workplaces, orother settings where potential extensive transmission or contact with people at increased risk for severe Illness from COV/D-19 is possible.

•ro minimize the risk of Covid-19 transmission, studenr-athletes should wait until 14 days of symptom monitoring have passed since they would not be able to social distance or

wear a mask during active practice or play. Such student athletes are permitted to return to class sooner since they can social distance (at least 6 feet) and wear a mask when around others in class.
