Hello Gators,

As educators, our teachers have been instructing your children about Jesus' journey to the cross. As Holy Week begins you as parents can re-enforce those lessons by attending Holy Week services with your children. Living our faith is the best example for our children.

Palm Sunday Mass: 4pm Saturday and 10am Sunday.

On this day, the Church celebrates Christ's entrance into Jerusalem to accomplish His paschal mystery. During this mass we receive palms and walk with Christ through the gospel on His Passion, death, and resurrection.

Holy Thursday Mass: 7pm

Today, we focus on the gift of the Eucharist as we celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper. Here, we remember the last meal Jesus celebrated with His disciples as He anticipated His Passion and death. The Blessed Sacrament is removed from the main sanctuary after mass in a solemn ceremony and taken to a place of repose for adoration.

Good Friday Service of the Passion of the Lord: 12:30 pm

On Good Friday, we focus on the suffering and death of Jesus. We recognize that our sins come with a terrible price and that Jesus paid that price willingly out of love for us. We observe Good Friday as a day of fasting and abstinence.

There is no Mass on Good Friday. This service begins in silence, with the priest lying prostrate before the cross. It continues with readings from Scripture, a homily, and prayers for God's blessings and mercy. Next, we adore the cross with a sign of reverence: often a kiss or a touch. The key is for us to show our gratitude for the means that God used to save us.

Finally, we bring the Blessed Sacrament out from the place of repose and receive Communion. The service ends in silence.\

Easter Vigil

Continuing our walk with Christ, we will have spent Friday and Saturday "in the tomb" with Jesus. With our service on Holy Saturday, we move from the tomb to the glory of the Resurrection.

The service contains four parts: the service of light, Liturgy of the Word, Christian initiation and renewal and holy Eucharist.

The service of light begins outside where we bless our Easter fire and Paschal candle. The Mass begins inside in darkness to remind us of Jesus in the tomb. As mass begins with readings of the story of salvation the only light is from candles held by each person in the church. Then, the lights come on as we sing the Gloria both signs of our movement from the darkness of the tomb to the glory of the Resurrection. We then bring into the Church those in the RCIA program who have been preparing since September. We remember our own baptism, thank God that we are a part of the long chain of salvation history through our membership in the Church, and rejoice with those who are joining us in the family of faith.

Easter morning Mass: 10am

We rejoice with great joy at Jesus' victory over sin and death: His victory is our victory. We have hope and joy in our lives because of the wonder of Christ's love conquering our sin and His life overcoming our death.

He is risen! He is risen indeed!

I encourage you to experience one of these services in addition to Easter mass. It is a great learning tool and a way to reinforce your own faith.

I would like to thank our teachers who will be moving on next year.

PALM SUNDAY

This Sunday is already Palm Sunday the beginning of the holiest week of the year. We will all be given a palm when we walk into church this Sunday and when we bring them home, we just don't know what to do with them. Here are instructions to make a cross and links at the bottom where you'll find videos showing you how to make a palm fish, and more.

<u>Storing palms until you can braid them.</u> If you can't braid your palms within an hour or two after Mass, place your palms in a zip-loc bag with a tablespoon of water, seal it, shake it, and place it in the fridge. That will keep it from drying out until you can braid it! They should keep that way for a few days.

Making a Palm Cross

START with a long vertical strip of palm as shown in the upper left drawing.

- Step 1 Make a diagonal fold near the middle of the strip so that the top part of the strip extends out to the right.
- Step 2 Fold C over B so that the top of strip extends to the left.
- Step 3 Fold C end under B so that top of strip extends to the right again.
- Step 4 Fold A under B and through slot and pull tight (shape looks almost the same but B now has more slots).
- Step 5 Bring A end up and through bottom slot at B and pull half way through and tuck A into top slot at B.
- Step 6 Bring C end over and through right slot at B and pull half way through and tuck C into left slot at B.

NOTES: In step 4 be sure to pull end A all the way through, snug and tight but gently. It is this step that creates the flat knot that has the slots you will use in steps 5 and 6. When you have completed step 6, push/pull to adjust the limbs of the cross and shape it.

The size of the cross depends on the size of the palm strip that you use.

Example: A palm strip size 13" long x 1/2" wide, will create a cross that is approximately 2 1/2 inches tall.

What Happened During Holy Week: (The Cheat Sheet)

- **Palm Sunday:** Liturgical color, red. Jesus rides a donkey into Jerusalem, the people wave palm branches at him shouting "Hosanna".
- **Holy Monday:** Liturgical color, purple. Jesus and his disciples go into the temple, and Jesus overturns the tables since people are selling things rather than praying there.
- **Holy Tuesday:** Liturgical color, purple. Jesus and the disciples return to the temple and teach the people many things with parables and give the people the new commandment.
- **Holy Wednesday (AKA Spy Wednesday):** Liturgical color, purple. Judas agrees to hand over Jesus for 30 pieces of silver.
- Holy Thursday (AKA Green Thursday): Liturgical color, white. Jesus has the Last Supper, which is the institution of the Eucharist and also the first mass. He also washes the feet of his disciples. Jesus asks his disciples to pray in the garden with him all night, and they fall asleep.
- **Good Friday:** Liturgical color, black. Jesus dies on the cross. All the things from the stations of the cross happen this day.
- **Holy Saturday:** Jesus is dead in the tomb. The evening of Holy Saturday is considered the "vigil", and Easter celebrating can begin then.




