Thank you for choosing St. Aloysius Gonzaga School for your child's education. St. Aloysius School as part of St. Aloysius Parish, is a catholic school committed to values incorporated throughout our excellent academic program. The staff integrates the best instructional practices to foster the gifts of all students, empowering them to meet the challenges of the future. At St. Al's we believe that the education of the child must be a team effort with the student, parent and teacher all working toward the same goal......student success.

Tuition for the upcoming year has been set at \$5,500.00. The tuition changes are in accordance with the Ohio Ed Choice Program. We work extremely hard to control expenses, provide competitive salaries to our teachers and set tuition at as affordable rate as possible.

At this time Fr. Hay and our business manager, Ken Schultz have decided to increase our tuition only \$100 for families that are active members of St. Aloysius Gonzaga Church. We thank the parish and its parishioners for contributing the balance of the fees to make up the difference between the standard rate that is now \$5,500.00 and the actual cost of educating each child. There is a St. Aloysius Scholarship available. These scholarshipd are only available to active parish members. Families using the Ohio Ed Choice Prog are not eligible. All families are asked to support the school in other ways such as volunteering, participation in fundraisers, etc.

St. Aloysius Gonzaga continues to develop its' intention to be known as a STEM School. As you can see by the following list, we provide a wonderful Catholic faith-based atmosphere for learning.

You can also find a copy of the SafeParish registration instructions by going to the AoC's Safe Environment Office webpage at <u>https://catholicaoc.org/</u> <u>offices/safe-environment</u> and going to *Top Resources* and then clicking the link for SafeParish.

All new volunteers and employees should follow the SafeParish registration instructions for creating a SafeParish account. During the registration process new volunteers and employees will be invited to complete their online background check and their child protection training online. New employees will also need to complete manual fingerprinting and submit a B4 form for approval.

The History of the Pretzel

After searching the internet for the history of the pretzel I couldn't believe how much information I found regarding this delicious snack. There seems to an agreement that a monk in the 600s in Italy decided to make a special Lenten bread for his fellow-monks. He took a long strip of dough and arranged it in the shape of arms folded over the breast in prayer. The three holes left by this shape represented the Trinity: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. These little breads were called bracellae, the Latin word for "little arms," from which came the German word bretzel.

Another story says that the monk gave these folded breads to children as a reward for learning their prayers. The Latin word for "little reward" is pretiola (pre-tzi-OH-la), which sounds a lot like pretzel! By the 16th century, children commonly hung pretzels around their neck on special occasions, and people adorned Christmas trees with the treats as decoration. German parents even hid tiny pretzels on Easter, an early version of modern Easter egg hunts.

In the 17th century, the pretzel's interlocking loops also came to symbolize undying love. Some couples even grasped the ends of the pretzel and unraveled it during wedding ceremonies — one possible origin of the phrase "tying the knot."

Pretzels once stopped a war

The Turks had plotted a dastardly invasion of the Austrian capital, which they intended to accomplish by digging tunnels underneath the city's walls. Their plans were foiled, however, by a group of monks who were up late baking pretzels in the basement of their monastery and heard the advancing enemy army.

The monks quickly alerted city officials, who were then able to counter the assault and stop the attempted invasion. As a result of the monks' bravery, the Austrian emperor awarded them their own coat of arms: two angry-looking lions holding a pretzel. This lasting symbol is still seen across Europe today, with many bakeries displaying it above their doors as a sign of pride and honor in their craft.

Hard pretzels are a distinctly American invention

The Pilgrims are notable for bringing beer with them on the Mayflower. But they also brought pretzels — the perfect snack to go with their favorite brew.

As an increasing number of German immigrants moved to the United States and began settling in the area now known as Pennsylvania, pretzels also took on a distinctly American flavor.

In 1861, a 26-year-old baker named Julius Sturgis founded the country's <u>first commercial pretzel</u> <u>bakery</u> in the tiny town of Lititz, located in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. Sturgis is also regarded as the first person to purposely create the true hard pretzels that we know today. These crispy snacks can last a long time stored in airtight containers. This allowed the pretzels to stay on store shelves longer and increased the region in which they could be sold.

What about the beer? I didn't forget but there was too much fun history about the pretzel. I'll talk about the beer next week! Make some pretzels with your children this weekend and tell them about the history. Who Knew?
