Arrival and Dismissal Procedures 2024-2025 - Proposal

If families follow the directions, the arrival policy will remain the same next year. Drop off starts at 7:00 AM, if more families dropped off between 7:00 and 7:30, this would alleviate the line of cars and wait. We will be asking students to exit cars up further up the driveway.

Proposed change to dismissal:

As always, safety concerns take precedence over convenience. There is no perfect solution to arrival and dismissal. There are safety concerns with the alleyway that we have been asked to address, mostly concerning the impact on the neighboring streets and access to the alleyway. There are moving cars and moving children. As much as we talk to kids about "staying in the yellow" there have been incidences of children running between moving cars.

Dismissal in the large lot across the street off Bridgetown is the proposal. Procedure has not been settled and Cars would exit once all children are in their cars. There would be a line up and car dismissal procedure.

If a sibling is in preschool that student would dismiss with preschool in their lot.

We would definitely need volunteers for dismissal. Primarily crossing guards. We would only cross at the cross walk and with the light.

A google questionnaire on your thoughts and ability to volunteer will be coming out next week.

MONDAY, APRIL 8 THERE WILL BE A SOLAR ECLIPSE!

Ohio residents will be able to see a total solar eclipse for the first time in Ohio in over 200 years. The path of totality will cross the state from southwest to northeast, passing through cities like Cleveland and Akron and just north of Cincinnati and Columbus. During the eclipse, the moon will completely block out the sun, casting a shadow on the Earth.

The next total solar eclipse in Ohio will be on Sept. 14, 2099, according to the Ohio Department of Natural Resources.

Most of them are old enough to know when the procedures aren't being followed. Staff has been following up with students in the morning asking them to please tell parents to drop off appropriately! Weirman Avenue and Bridgetown Road should NOT be used

MORNING DROP OFF/DISMISSAL PICK UP
THE ALLEY WAY WILL BE USED FOR BOTH MORNING DROP OFF &
DISMISSAL PICK UP. THE FRONT LOT IS NOT TO BE USED UNLESS THE
STUDENT IS ARRIVING LATE/TARDY (after 7:45am). AS ALWAYS, DROP
OFF OR PICK UP, YOU MAY PARK YOUR CAR IN THE LOT ACROSS THE
STREET, WALK YOUR CHILD ACROSS THE STREET, AND BRING THEM
TO THE CORNER OF THE BUILDING SO THEY CAN ENTER OR BE PICKED
UP AT THE CAFETERIA DOOR.

PLEASE ENTER THE ALLEY WAY BY USING CHURCH STREET ONLY. DO NOT ENTER CHURCH BY BRIDGETOWN ROAD. DO NOT DROP STUDENTS OFF FROM PILGRIM CHURCH PARKING LOT OR ON WEIRMAN AVENUE. FACULTY WILL BE OUT ENFORCING THIS PROCEDURE FOR THE SAFETY OF THE CHILDREN

MAKE SURE YOU PULL ALL THE WAY UP TO THE CAFETERIA DOORS WHEN FIRST IN LINE SO WE CAN FIT AS MANY CARS IN THE SAFETY LANE SO YOUR CHILD CAN EXIT THE CAR.

PRESCHOOL PARENTS – PLEASE STAY IN YOUR CARS AND THE PRESCHOOL TEACHER WILL COME OVER AND GET YOUR CHILD OUT OF THE CAR. If you know you will need time, please park in the lot behind preschool and walk your student up.
